1	The queen was seen, ELB	Routine inspection	Routine inspection. Possibly add a new super.
2	Skipped, no colony in situ	Skip <mark>ped, no</mark> colony in situ	Skipped, no colony in situ
3	The queen was seen in the super	The queen was seen in the supers, moved her down and closed up. Eggs were seen in the super. moved the super and queen excluder from the warm way to the Apiary standard (cold)	check the super for Larvae/capped brood.  Make sure no more eggs in the super. Check for EL in the brood box.
4	The colony is still expanding, and will still need feeding. Apiary Manager is topping the 1:1 syrup up in the week.	Moved one frame as the brood was not inside the pollen frame. fed more 1:1 syrup.	Routine inspection, continue to monitor stores and potentially add 1:1 syrup
5	The queen was not seen; around seven queen cells.	Colony was previously merged with Nuc4.  Queen not seen and about seven queen cells.  Knocked all but one back (capped).	Leave for two weeks.
6	Routine inspection, the queen was not seen	Eight frames of brood, two stores. The queen was not seen, one super was light, and all others were capped.	Routine inspection. Add another super, this will take it to seven. Decide if to move a fully capped super to a different hive as already very high.

7	The Queen was not seen, ELB.	Routine inspection., Queen was seen. two capped supers	Routine inspection. Check supers, decide if to add another super if a flow is on.
8	Lots of eggs, very busy in the latest super	Routine inspection.	Routine inspection. If flow on it may require an additional super. Check the supers as to how many are capped.
